Rijnlands Lyceum Wassenaar's Chess Championship 2025 was held in the Theatre Room on Wednesday, March 19th. This year we had a record of 36 participants and a lot of spectators as well! The tournament lasted 2.5 hours and saw intense competition until the last round, when Arda Goktepe from DP2B secured first-place scoring 5/5 points, for the second year in a row!

When it comes to the 2nd and 3rd place, a group of 5(!) students finished with 4/5 points, and after applying the pairing system tiebreak criteria Rishabh Bagul (MYP4B) was declared 2nd, while the bronze medal went to Naman Redkar (DP1B).

Although tiebreakers are common in chess tournaments, the 3 students who were not awarded but also achieved a 4/5 score, deserve a mention here: De Thouars Nicholas (MP4A), Gracias Ryan (MP3A) and Janjhua Simran (MP4B). Well done!

wildfires

Wildfires are a very serious issue that happen often but aren't normally brought to light. An example of this is in 2019 when the Amazon rainforest had a wildfire, people stopped talking about it after 3 months even though the fire was still going on. We want to stop that issue by informing you about what to do if you are in this situation or know someone who is.



The LA wildfire was an extremely terrible wildfire at the start of 2025 (January 7th). 29 people passed away and many got hurt or lost their friends, family or keepsakes. By the 24th of January 50,000 acres of land have been burned and 16,188 structures have been destroyed. There has been a total of 37,794 Emergency responses, with more than 31,000 people having evacuated. To learn more, scan the QR code to read our website.





NATURALIS

Our MYP4 students have recently set off on an exciting trip to Naturalis Biodiversity Center in Leiden, organized by the Digital Design and Science departments.

As part of their Website Design unit, students analysed Naturalis' website currently under redesign. Working in teams, they presented their user experience to the museum's management and developer team and suggested improvements. Their feedback proved to be invaluable to the developers. During the trip, students explored the interactive exhibits and already started thinking about how to best present them in their website designs, while enhancing their scientific knowledge and understanding of the different topics presented in the museum.

The trip was a success, providing students with a valuable real-world learning and professional experience. Their dedication and creativity impressed the museum staff, strengthening our collaboration with them.

This month students have been working with dedication on sketching wireframes to plan their websites.

As the project continues, Naturalis will visit our school to see the students' final website iterations and provide them with feedback on their work.









HAGAMUN

On March 7th, 8th, and 9th, 22 risk-taking ISW students attended the fifteenth edition of the Haganum Model United Nations (HagaMUN XV) at the Gymnasium Haganum, Den Haag. This school, established in 1394, features a beautiful neoclassical building. Several students commented that they felt like they were at Hogwarts due to the building's wide marble stairs, numerous statues, and imposing tower. The theme of this year's conference was "Borderless Dreams: Paving new paths for children's tomorrow," with the proceeds of the conference going to support the Dutch organization Oxfam Novib.











PRE-UNIVERSITY CLASSES

Several of our MYP5 and DP1 students have taken part in PRE-Classes at Leiden University this past term, taking the opportunity to extend their learning beyond the school curriculum.

The PRE-Class Law, Technology & Society was concluded on March 26th with a mock conference, where the participants gave presentations on the implications of new technologies (such as AI and deep learning models) on our social, ethical and legal system.




VISUAL ARTS EXHIBITION
